## Real Estate Valuation Overview (Appraisals)

This seminar is in intended to provide a general overview of the appraisal process as it relates to financial institution underwriting. The purpose of the presentation will be to acquaint financial institution personnel with the appraisal process and factors which influence the preparation of an appraisal prepared for use in the underwriting process.

The seminar will effectively be divided into three sections. First, the regulatory environment will be summarized. Federal and state legislation, particularly licensing and FIRREA will be discussed, specifically regarding their effect on who does appraisals, and what legal requirements must be complied with in the preparation of an appraisal. The Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP), which form the framework within which appraisals are prepared, will also be discussed.

Next, there will be a brief discussion of the theoretical environment, specifically with respect to the training available for appraisers. Finally, the practical environment will be overviewed. This section will be devoted to the actual process of developing and reporting an appraisal. This will include a brief discussion of area and property description, and the mechanics of the respective approaches to value.
