Leonard Chanin

A recognized expert in the field of consumer financial protection with extensive experience in regulation and supervision of the myriad statutes affecting retail banking, Leonard Chanin counsels financial institutions on consumer financial services law issues. Mr. Chanin regularly advises

clients on issues relating to the Truth in Lending Act, Electronic Fund Transfer Act, Fair Credit Reporting Act, Truth in Savings Act and Equal Credit Opportunity Act. Before rejoining Morrison & Foerster, Mr. Chanin served as the Assistant Director of the Office of Regulations of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau. There, he headed the agency's rulemaking team by supervising nearly 40 lawyers responsible for promulgating rules and regulations implementing consumer financial protection legislation. He also provided legal opinions to Bureau supervisory and enforcement offices on federal consumer financial protection laws. Prior to joining the CFPB, Mr. Channin served as Deputy Director of the Division of Consumer and Community Affairs at the Federal Reserve Board. While attending Washington University School of Law in St. Louis, Mr. Chanin was on the board of the Washington University Law Review. Mr. Chanin is a fellow of the American College of Consumer Financial Services Lawyers.

J.J. White, the Robert A. Sullivan Professor of Law Emeritus. has written on many aspects of commercial law. His book, Uniform Commercial Code (with Summers and Hillman), is considered to be the most widely recognized treatise on the subject. He is also the author of several casebooks on commercial, bankruptcy, and contracts law. Prof. White has served as the reporter for the Revision of Article 5 of the Uniform Commercial Code and is a Commissioner on Uniform Laws from Michigan. He also has served on several American Law Institute and NCCUSL committees dealing with revision to the Uniform Commercial Code. He received the L. Hart Wright Award for Excellence in Teaching for 2001-2002 and the Homer Kripke Achievement Award, given by the American College of Commercial Finance Lawyers. Prof. White earned his BA, magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa, from Amherst College and his JD, Order of the Coif, from Michigan Law School. He practiced

privately in Los Angeles before beginning his academic career at the University

of Michigan in 1964.

Max Nathan, Jr. practices primarily in the fields of estate planning, taxation and general civil law. He was president of the Louisiana Law Institute from 1998 through 2001, the Chairman from 2002 to 2004. agency of the State of Louisiana. As a long-time member of the Law Institute's Council, he is a principal author of the current Louisiana legislation on partnership, successions, donations and wills. With partner Carole Cukell Neff, he wrote the three-volume treatise, Louisiana Estate Planning, Will Drafting and Estate Administration (Lexis Law Publishing, 2d ed.). He is a member of the International Academy of Trusts & Estates and the American College of Trust & Estate Counsel. He is a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation and former president of the New Orleans Estate Planning Council. He served as chairman of the Mandatory Continuing Legal Education Committee of the State of Louisiana for six years, and was instrumental in implementing continuing legal education in Louisiana. He has been consistently listed in The Best Lawyers in America and in various Who's Who publications. He is a board-certified specialist in taxation and estate planning and administration.
